International Activity Badge



For youth and adult leaders, the **International Activity patch** (#00144) is a 3-inch diameter patch worn as a *temporary* patch centered on the right uniform pocket to recognize participation in unit, council, and world international activities. It is *not* worn in place of or alongside the World Crest emblem. There is also a 5-inch jacket patch (#00145) available for authorized wear.

There are many activities involving international Scouting that are eligible towards earning the International Activity Badge. The following listing provides requirements to earn this badge.

Requirements - Complete any two of the following:

1. Earn the Interpreter Strip
2. Be able to converse in a foreign language (Cub Scouts only)
3. Visit a Scouting group while in another country
4. Host a Scout or Scouter from another country (2 day minimum)
5. Participate in Jamboree-On-The-Air
6. Participate in a Pen Pal program (mail or e-mail) with a Scout from another country (Cub Scouts only, with adult supervision)
7. Participate in a collection for Scouting's World Friendship Fund
8. Earn the Cub Scout or Boy Scout World Conservation Award (youth only)
9. Participate as a member of your unit or a contingent unit in an activity outside of the United States. This must have a minimum duration of three days and nights.
10. Participate as a member of your unit or a contingent unit in an activity which includes Scouts and/or Scouters from other countries. This must have a minimum duration of three days.
11. Visit an international organization, embassy or World Bank and learn more about what they do.
12. Serve as a counselor in the European Camp Staff program.
13. Attend/participate in a World Jamboree in another country or a BSA sponsored Scouting Tour in another country.
