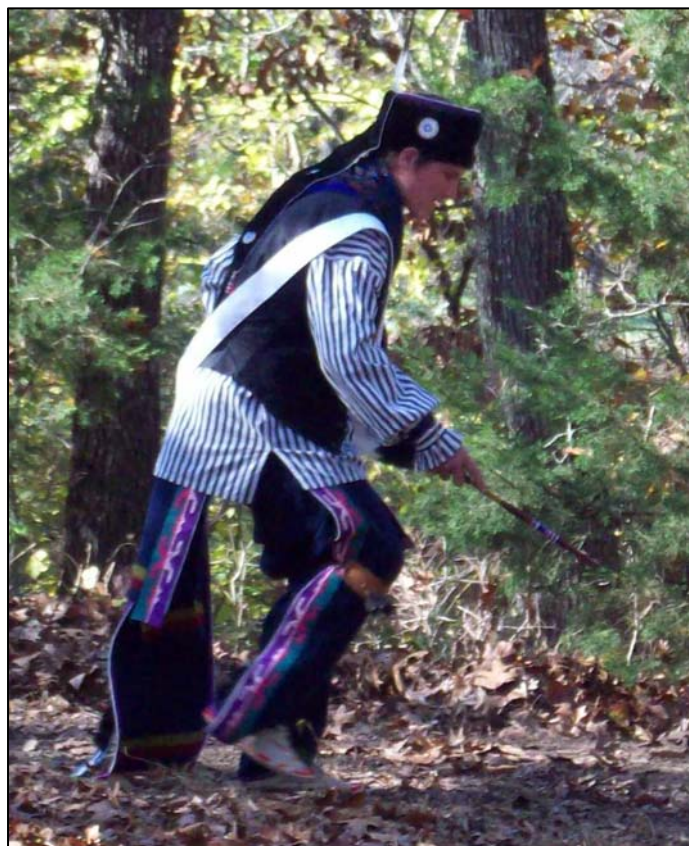
Fall Camporee 2008
